Here are the ingredients for "Make Your Own Pasta," which was terrific. There are all kinds of great ingredients to put on linguini and Udon noodles.




The boys played video games, while Molly watched and was probably not allowed to touch the mouse.




Lucas on the left, my grandson Max, on the right, with my granddaughter Molly peeked from behind.



Music? Of course, with Micah Ling on cello and my son Michael Andrew on my old Martin Guitar, which is as old as I am, born in 1941.




You can be sure we were never out of touch. My son Michael Andrew checking his email.




My daughter May, usually on tour singing, made it to the gathering and we had a wonderful time.




Micah gives Michael Andrew a bit of a massage.




Games before dinner.

The song was sung, and one candle had to represent what otherwise would be a blaze of light.




