At the end of the festival season each year, a private celebration is held near Lake City, Michigan, the annual "Harvest Gathering," now in its 9th year. Musicians from all over the Midwest (and the world) gather for three days on three stages and play music, not for attendees, but for and with each other. Perhaps 1,000 or so people find their way to it, but it is not advertised, or just enough to help musicians find it. Music goes pretty much all the time and the top organic chefs from Traverse City, Michigan come down and donate their time to serve non-stop food that has to be some of the best in the world. In fact, this very warm festival is the closest thing to the 1960s that I have experienced since then – lots of huggin' and new friends.

The Harvest Gathering was founded by Seth Bernard and is held on the Bernard farm, thanks to his father Bob Bernard. Seth and May Erlewine (my daughter) organize and put the concerts together each year.






